1. What is the NDIS?

The NDIS is a national system of funding and support services for people with permanent and significant disability. It is designed to help people with disability live more independently and participate more fully in society.

2. How does the NDIS work?

The NDIS is funded by the Australian Government and state and territory governments. It is managed by the NDIS Commission, which oversees the system and ensures that it is fair and transparent. The NDIS is divided into Local Access Coordinators (LACs) who provide support and information to people with disability.

People with disability can apply for NDIS funding through their LAC. The NDIS Commission will assess the application and determine whether funding is needed and what services should be funded.

- People with disability can choose to self-manage their funding, or have their LAC manage it for them.
- People with disability can choose to have their funding managed by the NDIS Commission.
